Temecula, Growing Fast, Plans Bank

Temecula, the live town at the end of the valley and the center of the big ranch country, has taken a big step forward in the organization of the Citizens' Bank of Temecula. The work preparatory to erecting a fine, two-story bank building is going steadily ahead. The building will stand on the corner formerly occupied by livery.

The beginning of this institution is an emphasis of the steady progress of the neighboring community and proves that Temecula valley is advancing rapidly. Temecula has the business, the capital and the earning power to support a strong fiduciary institution and the new bank is sure to be a winner from the start.
